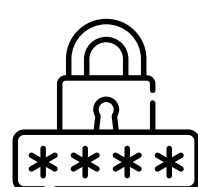

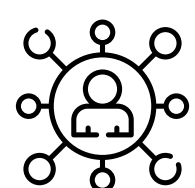
Click the links below to various solutions for keeping your digital identity secure.



Choose Strong, Unique Passwords

Enable two-step authentication to reduce the chance that someone gains access to social media or shopping accounts.

Use a password vault to keep track of your online passwords and to help you choose better passwords.



Practice Social Media Safety

Limit Facebook's ability to track your activity.

Configure social media accounts to restrict data collection and maximize privacy.

Use a VPN to keep your Internet communications private.



Secure Your Home Router

Secure your home router to help prevent attacks.



Monitor Your Identity Information

Sign up for Informed Delivery with the US Postal Service so you can see if any of your mail is missing from your mailbox.

Check to see if your personal e-mail addresses or phone numbers have been compromised in a data breach.

Consider subscribing to an identity theft protection service for additional monitoring and protection.

Hide your Google search results and contact site owner to request data be removed.

Setup a Google Alert to notify you if your name or data appears on the Internet.

Review data available on "people search" sites.
